FROM THE DESK OF MAYOR NIWINSKI

Our fall/winter issue of "The Sloan Connection" covers upcoming events for the next several months including Halloween, Christmas, and our Annual "Soup on Sunday". All residents are welcome to join in these activities, so mark the dates on your calendar and I hope to see you there.

This Friday, October 4th, we are hosting a VNA Flu Clinic at Village Hall. The hours will be from 9:00am to 2:00pm and is open to everyone.

On Saturday, October 5th, the Sloan Fire Department will be participating with other Cheektowaga companies in Fire Prevention activities at Kmart on Walden Avenue from 12:00 to 3:00pm.

Back by popular demand, we are offering another six week course in ballroom dancing, beginning October 21st.

In the Summer issue, we discussed the purchase of new equipment for the Department of Public Works. In June, the DPW received three zero-turn grass mowers. This machinery enables the department to work more efficiently while maintaining the grass at our two parks, Village Hall, Community Center, Lovejoy and Halstead properties. Additionally, the DPW is cutting grass at numerous houses throughout the Village that have been abandoned or are in foreclosure. We are still awaiting the arrival of our 2014 Johnston Vacuum Street Sweeper, which is on back-order with the manufacturer until November. This new apparatus will replace several pieces of equipment: the 27 year old sweeper, sewer vac truck and leaf vacuum.

I want to thank our resi-

dents, their friends and families who participated in our numerous summer events. We had record-breaking attendance at the four concerts in Griffith Park. The 1st Annual Village-wide garage sale on August 17th was a huge success, with over 80 houses participating and shoppers were in our Village from as far away as East Aurora and Eden. The Family Picnic the next day was extremely successful; the water slide was enjoyed by both children and adults. Over fifty people removed their shoes, rolled up their pants and hopped in the pool for duck races! It was quite a sight to see! FROM THE CLERK'S OFFICE

Are you annoyed when door-to-door solicitors come knocking? It seems they have the knack of ringing your doorbell the second you sit down to dinner. There are ways to prevent them from coming to your house. Call Village Hall and request your address be added to the "No Solicitors" list we maintain.

This list is provided to every person who receives a solicitation permit from the Village. You have the right to ask a solicitor for proof of a Sloan-issued permit. If they are unable to provide one, you can contact the Cheektowaga Police non-emergency number at 686-3501. Do not be pressured into providing copies of

your utility bills under the pretense of your gas or electric being turned off. This is a high-pressure sales tactic used by many companies. Never let a solicitor in your house and should they refuse to leave, call 911. The only exception to the permit requirement is for religious organizations. BE SMART, BE SAFE!

REMINDERS

Daylight Saving Time ends on Saturday, November 2. Don't forget to turn your clocks back one (1) hour before you go to bed at night. For Fire Prevention Month, replace the batteries in your smoke detectors and CO detector.

The winter parking ban goes into effect on November 15, 2013 and continues through April 1, 2014. Violators will be ticketed and/or towed. Parking permits for the village hall or fire department parking lots must be obtained from Village Hall. Permits are available after November 4th.

If you are 60 yrs or older, you qualify for the Erie County Nutrition Lunch Program. Meals are served Mon-Fri at noon for a suggested donation of \$3.50. Call Helen or Ed at 897-1389 for more information.

TOTES, TOTES AND MORE TOTES!

We are 9 months into our tote program and have seen a substantial increase in tonnage of recyclable materials. We all benefit with cost savings when we increase recycling and reduce the amount sent to landfills, so keep up the good work! You can recycle big items, such as hose reels and plastic chairs, by placing them alongside your recycling tote during your week for pick-up. Check the acceptable item list on your cart for a reminder of materials you can recycle. These are valuable commodities that are made into new products like napkins, park benches, clothing and carpeting. Modern Inc. will be mailing out 2014 recycling schedules to all residents in December. Watch the mail for your copy!



What Recycling Schedule is Your Street?

“A” Red Week- Wagner, Atlantic, Lackawanna, Village Lane, Michael,

Halstead, Curtiss, Griffith and those portions of Broadway, Reiman, Gates and Lovejoy that are west of Boll Street

“B” Blue Week- Boll, Currier, Roland, Crocker, Francis, Jackson, Rutland, Harlem, Gierlach, Franklin, Blick, those portions of Broadway, Reiman, Gates and Lovejoy that are east of Boll, and the Southside of Sloan off of William Street

There are still many questions regarding the garbage tote program. Listed below is the proper way to dispose of non-household trash.

Electronics- Drop at the Town of Cheektowaga Highway garage on Union Rd.

Branches- Tie securely in bundles not exceeding 4'. Place in garbage tote if possible. If they cannot fit, lay the tied bundles alongside garbage tote.

Grass clippings&yard debris- Bagged and placed inside your garbage tote.

Carpet & Padding- Roll and tie/tape securely in bundles not exceeding 4' and

leave alongside garbage tote.

Construction material- Modern Inc. will not pick up any construction material. Material can be taken directly to the transfer station at 793 S. Ogden for a small fee. This includes wood, fencing, drywall, roofing, siding, concrete, brick etc.

Leaves- Rake and pile (do not bag) on grassy area between street and sidewalk.

In an ongoing effort to reduce the rodent infestation, there should be no extra trash bags on the ground or on top of your tote.

Extra bags will not be picked up by Modern. Your garbage tote should not be overfull, causing the lid to not close securely. If you are in need of an extra tote, they are available for purchase at Village Hall: 95 gal trash tote \$45 / 65 gal trash tote \$42 / 65 gal recycling tote \$42. Additionally, all totes should be placed at curbside with the arrows pointing towards the street.

FROM ALAN WIEBERG, FIRE CHIEF

October 5th through the 12th is Fire Prevention Week. Fire Prevention Week was established to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire, the 1871 tragedy that killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless and destroyed more than 17,400 structures.

This year's message is "Prevent Kitchen Fires". More fires start in kitchens than any other part of the home. The leading cause of kitchen fires is unattended cooking and most fires start on the stovetop. Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, broiling or grilling food. If you are baking, roasting or boiling food, check it regularly and use a kitchen timer to remind you that you're

cooking. Keep anything that can catch fire - oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains- away from your stovetop. Always keep a lid nearby to smother small grease fires. For an oven fire, turn the heat off and keep the door closed. Get out of the house and call 911.

It is also the time of year to change the batteries in smoke and CO detectors. If your detectors are older than five years, it is time to replace them. Carbon monoxide is an invisible, odorless gas produced when fuels burn incompletely. Both cooking and heating equipment can produce this deadly gas. CO detectors should be installed on every sleeping level and on each floor where there is a fuel

burning appliance. Should your CO detector sound, immediately move to a fresh air location and call 911. With winter approaching in the next few months, please remember to run a generator only in a well ventilated outdoor area, away from windows, doors and vent openings. During and after a snowstorm, make sure vents for the dryer, furnace, stove and fireplace are clear of snow build-up.

With fall arriving, I would like to remind all residents that in the next few weeks, depending on the weather and the speed with which the leaves begin dropping, our department will begin regular leaf pick up and continue throughout the season as required.

We ask that the leaves not be bagged, but raked into piles on the grassy area between the sidewalk and street. Please do not place piles in the street, as they wash into the storm drains and clog the flow of rainwater. Leaf pick up will begin in the east side of the

Village (Harlem Rd.) to the west (Wagner Ave.) and Southside on a regular schedule until the first snowfall. We are currently servicing and getting our snow plows, salters, and equipment ready for the first sign of inclement weather.
