We would like to take this opportunity to commend all residents who exercised their right to vote on March 19th for the Village General election. Trustee Spence, Trustee Ping and I would also like to extend a personal thank you to all the voters who elected us to serve you for the next four years. We will continue our goals of providing you with superior services in the most cost-effective and efficient manner possible.

As discussed in the last Connection issue, we have completed the upgrades to the heating and air conditioning system at the fire hall. The new street sweeper has been ordered and we anticipate its arrival by August. This new apparatus will replace several pieces of equipment; the 27 year-old sweeper, sewer vacuator truck and leaf vacuum.

Len was dedicated to volunteerism, founding the Cheektowaga Airlines football league, Director of Southside Little League and St. Andrews's Holy Name Society. Len started his in-

volvement with the Village Board in 1997, when he was first elected as Trustee. He supervised the Youth Recreation Department, earning him the nickname of "grandfather" of the Village and oversaw much-needed improvements in Wrazen and Griffith Parks. Recognizing a need for community summer events, he was instrumental in forming the Sloan Arts Council, which will be celebrating its eleventh year of providing concerts for our residents. Continuing his commitment to public service, he won the Mayoral office in 2005. This past month, Western New York has experienced numerous rainfall events resulting in basement flooding for many of our Village residents. To combat this problem, we recommend homeowners contact their

plumber to have a backflow prevention device installed in their sewer line. This simple device will prevent sanitary backups occurring during heavy rainfalls. You can go to www.youtube.com/watch?v=FMBznnNV-ss to see how

this equipment operates.

To further assist with flood prevention, we ask that residents do not blow any grass clippings into the street while mowing. This debris washes into the storm drains

and clogs the flow of water leaving the Village. Although it is recommended to mulch your grass, if you choose to bag it, it must be placed inside your garbage tote for collection by Modern Corporation.

On June 3rd, I attended a presentation given by the NYS Office of the Attorney General. Its focus was on consumer protection against contractor fraud, identity theft and employee rights.

There are several steps you can take to reduce the possibility of home improvement scams. Check contractors by calling the local Better Business Bureau at 881-5222 or visit their website at www.upstateny.bbb.org. Shop around and obtain references from friends or family. Interview contractors and get written quotes with detailed information of what is to be completed. Before signing any contracts, call Village Hall to see if a Building Permit is required for the work that is to be done. We will check that your contractor has all required insurance, review your contract and work plan for code requirements, and inspect the work in

progress/completion if necessary. Also, your contract should include a specific time line for work to be completed and remember to never pay full price up front.

Identity theft is the fastest growing financial crime in the nation. Identity theft is when someone uses your personal identification, such as credit card or social security number (SSN), to obtain something of value. How can you protect yourself? Never provide any personal, bank account or credit card info to anyone who solicits you by telephone or door-to-door. Shred all expired ATM and credit cards, old insurance forms, checks and pre-approved credit card applications that we all receive. When creating passwords or PINs, do not use the last four digits of your SSN, birthdate, address, phone number or anything that is easily discovered by thieves. Keep a list of all credit card account numbers and the

appropriate customer service contacts in a safe, secure location should you need them. You can monitor your credit reports for any fraudulent activity by calling 1-877-322-8228 or visit www.annualcreditreport.com.

Many inquiries to the Attorney General have to do with employee rights in the work place. All employees have the right to safe working conditions that do not put you at risk for illness or injury. To file a complaint, you can call OSHA at 1-800-321-6742 or visit www.osha.gov. If you are injured on the job, worker's compensation covers the resulting medical bills and lost wages. For issues with a compensation claim, call 1-877-632-4996.
