FROM THE DESK OF MAYOR NIWINSKI

The Village is under an Order on Consent by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to develop and implement a comprehensive Sanitary Sewer Overflow (SSO) abatement program. This Order is in response to the Village discharging (via pumping) untreated wastewater from our sanitary system into the storm system during periods of heavy rain. In response to this Order, the Village has implemented a sump pump/drainage inspection requirement for every property sold in the Village. The DEC prohibits downspouts and sump pumps to drain directly into the sanitary system. If your system is designed this way, it should be disconnected immediately. All storm water should drain directly onto your lawn or through a

bubbler system. Additionally this year, our Highway Dept. will begin a five year program of flushing our sewer system and cleaning storm drain inlets.

I have been working cooperatively with our Erie County Legislator, Patrick Burke, who is receptive to the needs of our residents and the recent regulations by the DEC Order that we must follow. Legislator Burke has recently introduced legislation for the expansion of Erie County Sewer District No. 1 to include the Village of Sloan. I ask for your help in supporting Patrick Burke in September's primary election for County Legislator. We need to elect good people who assist the Village with our needs.

We are continuing work with the County Land Bank

(BENLIC) on vacant properties located in the Village. The rehabilitation of 290 Atlantic Avenue should be completed by fall and the house listed for sale. Also, through grant monies awarded from the state to BENLIC, we are pursuing demolition of 278 Reiman Street, which has been declared structurally unsound by our Code Official and Engineer.

I encourage all residents to help your community by assisting elderly or disabled neighbors, whether by taking out their trash or giving them a hand with their lawns. By working together and taking pride in our neighborhoods, we can keep Sloan a beautiful place to live.

CRIME AWARENESS

Recently there has been an increase in destruction in Griffith Park. We had 5 picnic tables damaged and there was a fire in one of the garbage cans. If you see anything happening, please call 911 immediately. Keep your car doors locked at all times, even in your driveway. The past several years have shown an increase at this time of year in car entry during the day or night.

As summer approaches, I would like to remind everyone with young children about pool safety. Whether you have your own pool or spa, or visit a public swimming facility, you should practice as many safety steps as possible. Never leave children unattended and keep them

away from drains and filters to avoid entrapment. If your child is missing, always check your pool or spa first. All gates should be installed with self-closing and self-latching hardware. If you use a ladder for your above-ground pool, it should be raised and locked in an upright posi-

tion when not in use. Since 2006, NYS requires an alarm that emits an audible sound if the water surface is disturbed to be used in every residential pool. For more information and tips, visit www.poolsafely.gov.

After notifying all interested parties, the building was demolished in August, 2014.
