FROM THE DESK OF MAYOR FERRUCCI

It has been four months since our last publication of the Sloan Connection was delivered to your door and another summer is over. We had four wonderful concerts in Griffith Park and, after many contractor delays, our Sports Court renovation was finally finished! My fellow Board members will join me in handing out Halloween candy on October 31st at the Halstead Community Center. Additional information on this and other events can be found on page four of this issue.

In August, Deputy Mayor Eric Czubaj purchased a home outside the Village and resigned his Board seat. We are searching for a village resident who would like to become involved with their community on a new level as a Trustee. If you feel like the right person for this position, please submit a letter of interest to Village Hall in the next few weeks. A heartfelt thank you to Eric for serving on the Board for so many years; leading our Youth Recreation Department, assisting with contract negotiations, bringing expertise to our sewer project and so much more. Congratulations to him and his family on this new chapter in their lives.

After two years of manufacturer delays and cancellations, our Highway Department should be

receiving our new plow trucks next spring. In anticipation of winter, the crew has overhauled our twenty-two-year-old trucks; replaced aging hydraulic lines and filters, and completed oil changes. Over the summer, we also received three new zero-turn mowers, replacing twelve-yearold equipment. Both the Fire and Highway Departments have an equipment replacement schedule that is reviewed and amended on an annual basis. This policy has worked well for the Village as anticipating and planning for the needs of high-cost equipment and vehicle replacements helps minimizes the fiscal impact on our property owners.

Utilizing our 2023 and 2024 Community Development Block Grant funding, we will be replacing the main playground set in Wrazen Park next summer. The existing structure is over twentyfive years old and new equipment that meets ADA standards will benefit our families with young children and have no financial impact on our taxpayers. We have finalized our project plan for the \$15,000.00 grant awarded this year from Erie County. Legislator Tim Meyers has been instrumental in procuring funding for the past four years. These grants have been used for Wrazen and Griffith Park improvements, purchase of picnic tables and sun shelters in the Splashpad, and Community Center upgrades. For 2023 funding, we will be purchasing new facility security cameras, holiday banners and tables for the Sloan Fire Hall.

We have just been awarded a \$100,000.00 grant from Assemblywoman Monica Wallace to upgrade our bathrooms for ADA compliancy in the Griffith Park facility. Over the winter, our engineer will finalize a design plan and we will be requesting contractor bids. Hopefully all work will be completed by the opening of the Splash Pad in June. Assemblywoman Wallace has obtained over \$400,000 in legislative grant monies for the Village of Sloan; funding used towards the Splash Pad installation, concrete sidewalks, renovations to Griffith Park Sports Courts, Arts Council Concert events and Fire Department equipment. Thank you to her for the continuous support of our Village community and assisting us in reaching our goal of fully ADA compliant parks.

I hope to see everyone at our holiday events: Halloween on October 31st, Christmas program on December 18th and the February 10th, 7:00pm "Two of Us" Beatles tribute concert band at the Sloan Fire Hall.

FROM VINCE FERRARCCIO, CODE OFFICER

2023 has been a busy year for Code Enforcement as we move into our second phase of mandated inspections of all multidwelling units. New York State requires municipalities to inspect all properties that have three or more apartments every three (3) years. If you have received a letter for an updated Certificate of Occupancy, please submit the application and we will schedule an appointment when all parties and tenants are available. By Law, I am required to inspect each unit and all common areas for code compliance.

This year, we have submitted a record twenty-seven (27) housing court cases with the Town of Cheektowaga. Complaints are referred to the Town for criminal prosecution only after repeated Letters of Violation have been mailed to the property owner. Court referrals are the last resort of a Code Enforcement Officer after non-compliance by the owner(s). If you have received a Notice of Violation, please do not ignore but contact my office to discuss the matter and develop a plan for remediation.

Thanksgiving may be only a

month away but live turkeys are not allowed in the Village of Sloan. Our Code does not permit any type of poultry, pigeons or farm animals to be kept due to the noise and rodent attraction.

For any code compliance issues in your neighborhood, please file a written notice with the Clerk's office in Village Hall. They will refer to me for an investigation. Likewise, if you are completing any work or have a contractor completing work on your property, call Village Hall at (716)897-1560 or stop in to 425 Reiman St. to inquire if a permit is needed.

TRASH AND RECYCLING INFORMATION

Waste Management (WM) uses fully automated vehicles which results in stricter adherence to regulations. No extra bags or loose debris can be placed outside of your trash or recycling totes. All regular household trash, grass clippings and yard debris must be bagged and placed inside of your tote. Materials may not protrude and the lid must close securely to prevent rodent access. Totes should be placed at curbside by 6:00am on the day of collection. Totes must be located within two (2) feet of the curb and with enough room for the hydraulic lift arm to operate. If you live on the parking side of the street, please place trash and recycling totes on your driveway apron to prevent them from being blocked by vehicles as WM will not return if inaccessible the first time.

Waste Management will pick up ONLY TWO (2) bulk items per address monthly. Bulk items consist of furniture, carpet/ padding (cut in 4' lengths or less, no wider then 18" and securely taped), box springs, mattresses, and toilets (which all must be wrapped in plastic or bagged). Large plastic bags are available for purchase at various local home building stores. Items NOT ACCEPTED: microwaves, air conditioners, concrete, tires, construction material, televisions and computers.

WM has seen an increase of items placed for disposal in the recycling totes that are NOT AC-CEPTABLE such as food, plastic bags, rugs, bedding, clothing, carpet, hoses, holiday lights, extension cords, clothes hangers, napkins, plates, cups, tissues, foam or plastic to-go containers, yard waste, wood, concrete, con-

struction debris, blow up pools, auto parts and hazardous waste.

For any questions on what is acceptable BULK or RECYCLA-BLES please contact WM Customer Service at 1-800-972-4545 or Village Hall directly. Our DPW picks up metal items (not e-waste) on a weekly basis.

UPCOMING BULK DATES: November 30th, December 29th.

EXCESSIVE TRASH can be taken directly to the Eastside transfer station at 793 South Ogden, near Big Lots. There is a fee charged, based on weight.

ELECTRONIC OR E-WASTE recycling is now available at the Town of Cheektowaga Highway Garage located at 3145 Union, Monday through Friday from the hours of 7:30am to 1:00pm. This service is provided FREE to all residents!

To kick off the opening of the Youth Recreation Center this season, we are having a pizza party for the kids! We invite Village Resident children (no nonresidents for this event please!) ages 8 or older to join us on November 2nd from 5:00pm to 8:00pm! As fall approaches, the DPW crew ask that our residents rake all leaves onto the grassy area between the sidewalk and curb. Please do not rake into the street, as this blocks the storm drains and causes flooding. We will continue to pick up leaves on a rotating basis throughout the fall season until the first snow- no need to call us for a pickup! As a reminder, do not shovel, blow or plow snow into the street. This results in a driving hazard and is against both Village and NYS Vehicle & Traffic Laws.
