### FROM THE DESK OF MAYOR THOMAS FERRUCCI



2020 has been an extremely unusual and difficult year for everyone as we adjust to the "new normal" that the COVID19 pandemic has resulted in. For the safety of our residents and youth, we had closed the Community Center in March in response to Governor Cuomo's Executive Order. In June, as New York State entered Phase 4, we developed protocols and safety measures and were able to open the Griffith Park Splash Pad and the Senior Center. After a busy, hot summer season, the splash pad concluded its second year on August 30th. The Seniors are meeting only Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursdays and anxiously await the start of the Erie County Lunch Program.

Anyone who has driven through the Village over the last several months is aware of construction underway on Gates, Franklin, Gierlach, Crocker and Michael streets. The Erie County Water Authority is replacing supply lines to better service our residents and reduce the number of water main breaks for our area. In the end of September, our Highway Crew Chief and I met with the ECWA project engineer and construction manager to review progress. The project start was severely delayed in spring due to COVID and has been complicated by both water and gas line breaks in the area. The goal is to finish the project in the east end of the Village, including street paving and sidewalk replacements. Michael Street cannot be completed until spring of 2021 but will have binder laid down so the street is drivable and can be plowed. Prior to milling and paving, the Village's contractor will be completing sanitary sewer repairs and connections on Gierlach. Coordination of work with utility providers allows us to complete jobs efficiently and saves taxpayer money.

In August, we repaired our sanitary sewer lines while Erie County Highway was undergoing road reconstruction on William Street. Collaborating with other municipalities benefits us financially and saves on repair costs for our residents. Other sewer repairs this year by the Village were the replacement of six storm drain inlets on Lackawanna, Gates and Roland Streets. Due to the financial impact of the pandemic at the state level, our sewer grants were temporarily placed on "hold" several months ago. During a conference with the Environmental Facilities Corp. last week, we were informed that the hold has been released for some municipalities grants across the state, and Sloan was included. This enables us to proceed with the three-year sanitary sewer project as planned.

Earlier in October, I met with County Clerk Mickey Kearns and representatives from the WNY Law Center regarding 2331 Broadway. The Village had reported the property to the "Zombie Task Force" at the beginning of 2020 and they have been vital in moving along the foreclosure action and ultimately, the demolition of this property. We also work closely with the Buffalo & Erie Niagara Land Bank, referring properties that are available at the County auction for back tax sales. Of the Sloan properties purchased by BENLIC last year, one has been sold to a family and the other is being fully rehabilitated by the land bank themselves and will be offered for sale by springtime. Building successful partnerships with organizations benefits our community and I want to thank Clerk Kearns. members of the WNYLC and BENLIC Director Jocelyn Gordon for their collaborative effort in removing blighted properties from our neighborhood. Village Halloween activities are planned for the 31st. Please refer to Deputy Mayor Czubaj's article on Youth Recreation for the details. See you around the Village!

The Splash Pad concluded its second, successful summer providing a respite from the heat in July and August. In conjunction with the Cheektowaga-Sloan School District, 1812 free lunches and 1812 packaged breakfasts were served in Griffith Park to children in our community. The park also saw the construction of a new shelter, partially funded by a grant from Erie County Legislator Timothy Meyers. It is a beautiful addition and will be available

next year for residents' use.

Due to COVID19, the Youth Recreation Center has not opened. Closure will continue indefinitely as we monitor Governor Cuomo's Executive Orders and look how to open safely and effectively.

The Village will be hosting its annual Halloween parade on October 31st. A slight change in tradition due to COVID19, the parade will begin at 6pm from St. Andrew's Church on Crocker & Reiman then travel to Village Hall, where we will be

hosting a "Trunk or Treat" in the parking lot. We ask that everyone wear their masks and maintain social distance from other families throughout the event. House to house trick or treating will be allowed until 8pm. If residents want to give out treats but are uncomfortable due to the pandemic exposure, you can bring your candy to Village Hall and we will distribute for you or bring your car and join in the trunk or treating with us! Safety is a top priority along with the kids having fun!!
